The Boulder Junction Community Foundation was incorporated in 2010 and in 2011 obtained its federal income tax exemption under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

- Classified as a public charity, the Foundation is qualified to receive a variety of tax deductible contributions to the extent allowed by law.
- We established a Restricted Endowment Fund to facilitate our mission efforts.
- Starting December 2012 to the present, we have focused our efforts on assisting the town in raising funds for our new Community Center, Library, Ball Diamond, Fire Department, Chamber of Commerce, and Downtown beautification projects.

The time has come for us to focus our efforts on our own mission and to build our Restricted Endowment Fund so we CAN play an important role in preserving our traditions, improving our town and providing exciting new opportunities for Boulder Junction for many years to come. To do this, we need your help to reach our lofty goal:

To raise \$1 Million Dollars in our Restricted Endowment Fund so we can give back \$50,000 **EACH and EVERY year...FOREVER.**

Can you imagine how much this could help Boulder Junction grow and thrive now and for the future generations? It would be truly amazing! CHOSE THE WAY TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

The Boulder Junction Community Foundation is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization created by and for residents and visitors of Boulder Junction. Founded in 2010, our mission is to preserve and enhance Boulder Junction for present and future generations. We accomplish this by responsibly asking, managing, and distributing endowment funds created by charitable gifts. The Foundation offers a variety of giving and fund options to accommodate your favorite project or program. Whichever you choose, you will have the satisfaction of knowing that your gift, large or small, will benefit your community today, tomorrow, and always. We recommend that you contact your financial advisor to discuss the benefits of including the Boulder Junction Community Foundation in your tax and estate plans. It's your legacy.

GIVING OPTIONS

Outright Gifts of cash, stocks, bonds, or other assets are the easiest and most convenient way to donate. Your charitable gift qualifies for the maximum tax advantage allowed by law.

Gift of Life Insurance or Retirement Plan Beneficiary enables you to name the Boulder Junction Community Foundation as beneficiary with tax benefits that you can enjoy during your lifetime.

Bequest by Will by naming the Boulder Junction Community Foundation as your beneficiary in your will. You can make a gift of beneficiary, with tax benefits that you can enjoy during your lifetime.

Charitable Gift Annuity enables you to make a gift of cash or property to the Foundation now, get immediate tax benefits, and ensure that you or a loved one receive fixed quarterly or annual income payments for life.

Charitable Remainder Trust enables you to place cash or property in a trust that pays annual income to you, or another named beneficiary, for life. After your death, the remainder of the trust transfers to the Foundation and is placed into the charitable fund you have selected. You receive income tax benefits in the year you establish your trust.

Charitable Lead Trust allows you to place cash or property into a trust that pays a fixed amount to the Foundation for a specified number of years. Once this period ends, the assets held by the trust are transferred to the beneficiaries you name. In some cases, you receive a substantial reduction in federal gift and estate taxes.

TYPES OF FUNDS

Restricted Endowment Fund is managed, invested, and kept in perpetuity to provide earnings for the benefit of charitable causes in Boulder Junction. The fund is held and managed by the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin. Grants are available annually through this fund to enhance Boulder Junction for present and future generations. Our goal is to raise \$1,000,000 in this fund to enable the Foundation to give back \$50,000 to the community each year...forever.

Community Enhancement Funds are managed and kept at our local bank to provide grants on an as needed basis for the benefit of charitable causes in Boulder Junction. These funds include: Arts & Culture Fund, Bike Trail Fund, and Greatest Needs Fund.

GRANT GUIDELINES

What We Support

- The Foundation is dedicated to supporting innovative ideas for:
- Projects that enhance the quality of life for Boulder Junction's citizens and visitors.
- Projects that support human services, education, health and recreation, arts and culture, the environment and community development.
 - Projects involving nonprofits that strengthen and enhance the Boulder Junction community.
 - Projects that protect those characteristics of our community that are so loved.

Who may apply?

The Foundation welcomes grant requests from organized groups throughout the Boulder Junction area, including:

- Charitable organizations classified as 501(c)(3) under the Internal Revenue Code
- Local units of state or national organizations, and independent nonprofit organizations
- Schools, governmental units and religious institutions providing programs benefiting the public at large

Grant Guidelines

Project Eligibility:

- 1. The project addresses unmet needs within the Town of Boulder Junction that are consistent with the charitable purposes of the BJCF. The project clearly falls within BJCF's mission.
- 2. The project is consistent with the mission and purposes of the organization applying for the grant.
- 3. The applicant organization has provided evidence satisfactory to the Board of Directors that it has the financial capacity and the ability to complete the project and, if applicable, provide for its long-term management and maintenance.
- 4. The project can be completed within two years of the grant approval date.
- 5. If a project is a phase or component of a larger project, the component is usable or functional in and of itself.
- 6. The project does not meet any of the criteria of Ineligible projects and project costs under Bylaw X of the BJCF Bylaws. Bylaws available at boulderjunction.org.

The Boulder Junction Community Foundation seeks to promote respect for all people. We do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, national origin, ancestry, age, medical condition, disability, veteran status, marital status, sexual orientation or any other characteristic protected by law; we expect grant applicants to hold similar standards.

2017 COMMUNITY GRANTS

Since our inception in 2010, grants have funded community initiatives for arts and culture, education, health and wellness, and community resources for preserving and enhancing Boulder Junction for present and future generations. Grants totaling \$7900 were awarded in 2017:

Boulder Junction Chamber of Commerce Music on Main Street

A \$400 grant was awarded to help support the funding of artists performing at the weekly summer music series. Another grant of \$1500 helped fund the building of a new stage used for Music on Main Street. The stage is a much-needed addition to this event, providing shelter from the elements for the artists who perform. The pine trees behind it are a beautiful back-drop. Individual and business donations as well as the Foundation grants helped to support this event which is now in its 10th season.

Town of Boulder Junction - Bike Trail Enhancement

The Boulder Junction Community Foundation accepted a donation from the Boulder Junction Bike Trail Up-Shift Group in 2016 and in turn awarded grants to the Town of Boulder Junction in 2016 and 2017 totaling \$4400. The grants were used to install two fixtations in 2017 located along the Boulder Junction legs of the 45-mile Heart of Vilas County Paved Bike Trail System at the intersections of Hwy H/Hwy K and Hwy M/Hwy N. A fixtation is an outdoor bike stand with several bike tools and a tire pump built into it. These fixtations can accommodate two bicycles at the same time.

Boulder Junction Public Library

A \$450 grant was awarded to purchase Lego sets for the Children's Summer Reading Program awards. Boulder Junction Public Library's "Build a Better World" summer reading program lays the groundwork for children to become lifelong readers and learners.

Boulder Junction Volunteer Fire Department

A \$500 grant was awarded to enhance the annual Chicken BBQ dinner with games and entertainment for the entire community to enjoy.

The Chamber truly appreciated the Foundation awarding them two (2) grants in 2017 to enhance the summer music program. Over 1,000 people turned out in 2017 to enjoy these popular events. The music heard throughout downtown offers a great atmosphere to our community.






Financials


The Boulder Junction Community Foundation is a 501(c)(3). The Finance Committee and Board of Directors monitor and review the investment management services provided by the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin in managing the Boulder Junction Community Foundation Endowment Fund. In 2017, as approved by the Board of Directors, \$53,615 was contributed to the Restricted Endowment Fund; \$30,255 were contributions from donors, and \$23,360 coming from net proceeds of Foundation events and sponsorships. Community Enhancement Funds (Arts & Culture Fund, Bike Trail Fund, and Greatest Needs Fund) are managed directly by the board of directors and held at Huntinaton Bank in Boulder Junction. At the recommendation of the Foundation's financial advisor, Mark Hilaendorf, \$2,308 was contributed to create a Reserve Fund. Annual contributions to the Reserve Fund of \$2,000 or more will continue until the fund balance is equal to two years of Operating Expenses. Grants totaling \$7,900 were awarded.
